#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE) shares a geographic boundary with the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM). HRCE operates 137 schools serving more than 59,000 students and employs approximately 10,000 people.

HRCE and HRM share the common goal of creating a healthy, sustainable, viable and well-educated community. This shared vision of excellence provides a framework for the annual supplementary education funding contributed to by the residents of HRM. Supplementary funding has a long history dating back prior to the amalgamation of Bedford, Dartmouth, Halifax, and Halifax County into the HRM in 1996.

Supplementary education funding supports fine arts programming, library support specialists, social workers, and other program and service enhancements for students in communities throughout the municipality.

The current five-year agreement between HRM and HRCE has been extended until March 31, 2025. HRCE submits an annual report and budget to HRM outlining how and where supplementary funding will be allocated according to the agreement's terms.

The contents of this report, as defined in sections 8 and 9 of the agreement, include:

## 8. PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- 8.1 Each year of the Term, the Program shall be evaluated according to the following measurable outcomes:
  - (a) The number of students by grade level and Family of Schools who have the opportunity to receive enhanced fine arts programming in their classes; (see page 9)
  - (b) The enrolment in optional fine arts programs by grade, age and Family of Schools; (see pages 9-17)
  - (c) The frequency, range and locations of fine arts performances; (see pages 18-19)
  - (d) The breadth of fine arts programming available across HRM; (see pages 20-21)

(e) The number of students by grade level and Family of Schools who have the opportunity to receive an identifiable educational enhancement in their school. (see page 9-17)

## 9. ANNUAL REPORTING

- 9.1 HRCE shall provide an annual report to HRM of the expenditure of the Funding (the "Annual Report"), which shall be provided to HRM within 90 days of the end of the fiscal year beginning in 2021.
- 9.2 The Annual Report shall include the following measures:
  - (a) a summary of the Program supported by the Funding for the applicable school year.
  - (b) a description of the scope of the Program supported by the Funding, as described in Section 8 of this Agreement; and
  - (c) a budget update, including allocation for the current year and multi-year projection.

The HRCE thanks Halifax Regional Council for their continued stewardship of supplementary education funding.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF PROGRAMS

HRCE allocates supplementary education funding into the categories of Halifax Regional Arts (HRA) and other enhancements.

During the 2023-24 school year, HRA supported and enhanced fine arts in HRCE through a broad range of learning experiences in dance, drama, music, and visual arts. Goals for programming included meeting the needs of our diverse populations, understanding our diverse cultural and historical contexts, and exploring new and innovative ways to bring fine arts to the youngest residents of HRM.

All students in HRCE from Grades Primary-12 (P-12) had fine arts enhancements available to them throughout the 2023-24 school year. These took a wide variety of forms, including:

This year, HRA continued to expand programming. Two new Family of Schools Fine Arts Specialists were added to support larger school communities. One position, focusing on visual arts, was shared between the JL Ilsley and Lockview Families of Schools. As well, a position focusing on drama and dance covered Woodlawn High, Dartmouth High, and for the first time, programming was added officially to BFEC. A Tech Program was continued for student training and hands-on production work. A Tech Support position was added to be available to schools in assessing, assisting, and bolstering existing tech equipment in schools, and supporting school productions in HRCE. A program was expanded and refined to support musicals and shows in schools, with funding, materials, and staff. Access to a choral clinician was also increased.

A Music Therapy program for students with special needs was provided in both virtual and inperson sessions for 12 Families of Schools. In-person sessions were the primary form of delivery, but in response to different circumstances throughout the year, virtual synchronous and asynchronous lessons were made available so that students with special needs could access music therapy support.

HRA also provided financial support to special projects and initiatives that would otherwise be unattainable for many school communities. All expenses were paid for these experiences for students. Examples include:

- A production of Macbeth with Shakespeare by the Sea involving students from 10 HRCE schools that performed at the Junior High School Drama Festival and the High School Drama Festival. Two daytime matinees for community schools and one evening performance were also held.
- Dramafest access for 15 HRM schools with performances, keynote speakers, workshops, Q&As, and talkbacks with cast and crew. HRA paid for school registration fees and helped to lower the cost for participating students at high schools for individual registration fees. More than 200 HRCE students participated in 15 hours of daytime programming, and many returned for evening performances and events.
- 48 evening Pottery and Glass Fusion Classes for HRCE students and supporters were held at Rocky Lake Junior High and Cole Harbour District High.
- 55 classrooms throughout HRCE were provided with virtual access to Mermaid Theatre.
  This included over 40 videos on puppetry and performances as well as Duolingo
  Mermaid TV Series on Mi'kmaq, French, Gaelic, and African Nova Scotian culture and
  language.
- HRA sponsored 21 Neptune Theatre Touring Company performances at schools across HRM.
- Newcomers Halifax Theatre for Young People's play that premiered at Pier 21 toured seven HRCE schools through funding from HRA.
- Eastern Front Theatre Supported Eastern Front Theatre experiences for 100 HRCE students to attend a performance at the Stages Festival.
- Bboyizm, the nationally recognized dance troupe, performed at Woodlawn High for their African Heritage assembly and toured Dancers to Woodlawn, Millwood and Citadel High School Dance 11 workshops.
- African Nova Scotian Fine Arts Specialist Cindy Cain taught traditional stepping routines, also known as Stomp, to all HRCE Dance 11 classes and brought the first semester classes together to perform.
- HRA hosted the first-ever HRCE-wide Black Excellence Assembly featuring Maestro Fresh Wes, student performances, and art from across HRCE. 480 students from 26 different schools came with their African Nova Scotian Student Support Workers.
- Supported 15 schools with fees, coaching, and production support in the Canadian Improv Games, providing students with more than 40 hours of coaching each and five nights of performance opportunities. This represents 50 hours of rehearsal and performance time each for 180 students. HRA also helped to support the team going to Nationals representing Nova Scotia with accommodations, funding, and staffing.
- Unity Charity programming arranged by HRA included spoken word poetry, hip hop dance, and beat making workshops in 11 different schools for 66 workshops involving more than 1,000 HRCE students.
- Supported and facilitated the Young Film-makers Collective at J.L. Ilsley High School.
- Provided technical support, equipment, and guidance to schools for 21 school productions.
   This included 70 performances involving more than 600 students and more than 1,000 hours of rehearsal and performance time.
- Provided resources and support to school theatrical productions in the areas of set design,

set construction, choreography, and stage management for 21 theatrical productions in elementary, junior, and senior high.

- Provided transportation for students to attend performances of the Nutcracker.
- Provided transportation for students to attend performances at Neptune Theatre.
- Provided funds for local artists to do workshops and performances.
- Provided support for schools in creating school wide murals in support of Indigenous culture.
- Provided sound and lighting for holiday and spring concerts in schools across HRM.
- Organized and supported a series of Hip Hop Dance and Spoken Word workshops in seven schools in the HRCE.
- Provided support for schools in creating school wide murals in support of Indigenous culture.
- Provided virtual dance opportunities for more than 1000 students during International Dance Day.

In the category of Other Enhancements, all schools in HRM benefited from library support staff during the 2023-24 school year. In addition, Supplementary Funding provided social workers to support HRM students.

## 3. SCOPE OF FINE ARTS PROGRAMS

In 2023-24, all students in HRM had the opportunity to receive enhanced fine arts programming in their classes and in their schools.
